Safeguarding vulnerable adults - Nursing in Practice

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Each practice should have a designated lead for safeguarding adults at risk. They should be aware of the respective safeguarding adults leads within the local clinical commissioning group (CCG) and the local authority safeguarding adults team. We need to see evidence that: the practice gives sufficient priority to safeguarding adults at risk

Safeguarding Adults In Nursing Practice

Safeguarding vulnerable adults. The primary aim of safeguarding is to keep an individual safe and prevent further abuse from occurring. The Department of Health for England and Wales states six principles of good safeguarding practice : Empowerment: presumption of person-led decisions and informed consent.

Safeguarding is relevant to all of nursing practice, in all settings, whether with children or adults. Effective safeguarding is underpinned by two key principles: safeguarding is everyone's responsibility; for services to be effective each professional and organisation should play their full part

How practice nurses can protect their patients . Safeguarding adults is everyone's business and practice nurses have a professional duty as directed by the Nursing and Midwifery Council.¹ Practice nurses should be able to promote and protect the rights of patients who are not able to protect themselves from harm or abuse.

One of the structures involved in furthering the safeguarding policy and agenda is Safeguarding Ireland which is a multi-agency committee and inter-sectoral body established in December 2015. Safeguarding Ireland published its Strategic Plan

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2017-2021 in November 2016, and contributed to the development of the Adult Safeguarding Bill 2017.
